EXECUTIVE SUMMARY TOM MOORE

2015 WAYNE AND JO ANN MOORE CHARITABLE FOUNDATION

2015 was a good year for the Foundation regarding giving and receiving.

The 2015 grants total \$2,060,500.00 compared to \$2,316,900.00 in 2014 and \$2,028,933.00 in 2013. The Foundation made 101 grants in 2015 as compared to 102 in 2014.

I am a bit concerned as we start into 2016. The price of oil has dropped 60+% since the end of 2014 and continued to drop as we start 2016. The oil and gas runs contributed \$1,309,525.00 in 2015 as compared to \$2,087,895.00 in 2014. Also petroleum industry lawsuits and lease bonus contributed another \$900,450.00 to the Foundation. The lawsuits and lease bonuses are not expected to significantly contribute to the Foundation in 2016. The year-end UBS values remain in the \$39,000,000.00 to \$38,000,000.00 range as they did in year 2014.

We must judiciously consider how much and to what we granted in 2016. The Foundation is designed to last into perpetuity, and it is our duty to make sure that it does.




